

Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Green Electricity Purchases

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Pennsylvania's Renewable Energy Purchase

- Initial work on the 2000 contract began in 1999
- Pennsylvania was the first state in the nation to voluntarily purchase clean, renewable power as part of the total government electricity usage







Goal:

- To take a Leadership by Example approach in the Promotion of Alternative Renewable Power
- Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions
- Promote Energy Independence and security by Reducing Dependency on Foreign Oil
- Promote Economic Revitalization







How Much is Enough?

- Suppliers in 1999 couldn't accurately predict the amount of "Green" electricity available
- Initial contract conservatively set at 5% of total commonwealth load – approx. 50,000 MWH/yr
 - Doubled to 10% in 2004
 - ☐ Doubled to 20% in 2006
 - ☐ Currently at 28% 277,399 MWH/yr.







Pennsylvania's Eligible Renewable Sources

Wind

Solar – Thermal and Photovoltaic

Biomass – Switch grass, Willow, Wood Waste

Hydro

Methane – Landfill, Agriculture, Coal Mine

Waste Coal – Fluidized Bed Culm to Energy







2000 Initial Green Electricity Contract

- Represented 5% of Total Electricity Load
 Purchased as Green Electrons
- 100% Tier 1 Renewable Electricity
 - ☐ 95% Existing Hydro
 - **□** 5% Wind
- Average Premium 1.3 c/KWH
- Vendor: Green Mountain Energy







Current Green Electricity Contract

- 28% Total Electricity Load 277,399 MWH's
- 100% Renewable Electricity as Energy Credits
 - □ 2% PA Wind
 - □ 55% National Wind
 - ☐ 43% Existing Hydro
- Average Premium 1.98 c/KWH
- Vendor: Community Energy







Lessons Learned

- Initially Contracted for Green Electricity
 - ☐ Matching individual facility load to suppliers statewide was an administrative nightmare
 - ☐ Contracting for Renewable Energy Credits as they became available was cheaper and easier
- Develop a Best Value Strategy that allows vendors to provide the best package at the most competitive price.







Develop a Best Value Strategy

Developed a formula for analyzing each attribute

Criteria Included:

- Price
- Type of Generation
- Economic Impact
 - o Location of Generation
 - o Age of Source
 - o Creation of Pennsylvania Jobs







Additional Economic Benefit Realized by the Commonwealth

- Initial green energy vendor invested proceeds of contract into fledgling Pennsylvania wind power generation initiatives.
- Purchase of green electricity has strengthened the production of green energy while subsequently contributing to a broad program of economic revitalization in Pennsylvania.







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
