Portland's Sustainable Procurement Policy

Purpose Statement

Recognize the impact of your purchasing decisions

Every Purchase has;

Environmental, Economic, Social & Human Health impacts

General Policy Statement

- Employees will incorporate the following when writing specifications for...;
 - Environmental
 - Fiscal (Economic) considerations
 - Social Equity





Portland's Sustainable Procurement Policy

General Policy Statement

- Utilize Best Practices as they evolve
- Evaluate the Toxicity of products (Precautionary Principles)
- Independent, third-party social or environmental (eco) product labels

Implementation and Responsibilities

- Citywide application to comply with Policy
- Harmonize and improve standards
- Provide assistance, outreach & education
- Evaluate suppliers sustainable practices
- Develop "boilerplate" language for solicitation documents





Social Equity

Equal Benefits

- Based on the principle of parity
 - Benefits offered to one group must be offered, on equal terms, to the other group
 - Does not require contractors to provide health benefits to their employees
- Bid/Proposal Rejection
 - Debarment from being awarded a contract up to 3 years <u>OR</u> until Contractor is brought into compliance

Sweatshop Free Procurement

- Use anti-sweatshop criterion in procurement decisions
 - Uniforms & clothing products have inherent social & human health impacts
 - Promote better working conditions
- Award to supplier who is 'most' compliant
 - Full Delayed Waivers Sanctions Remedies
- Point of assembly factory location information
 - Public disclosure
- Compliance verification
 - Independent monitoring
- Code of Conduct





Procurement's Role

Take Direct Action:

- Put Sustainability Practices to work (3-R's)
- Incorporate environmentally preferable product specs
- Analyzing impact of procurement decisions
- Be a resource (Become a SME for your organization)

Lead the Way:

- Become a sustainability leader in projects & initiatives
- Be a knowledgeable source for sustainable tools/resources
- Offer a sustainability-oriented perspective
- Work with socially responsible contractors
- Get serious about life cycle cost analysis (Cradle/Cradle)
- Promote alternatives (energy, facilities, fleet, procurement)
